Our end of year data from 2024 was very pleasing and we are proud of all our students for the effort they put into their learning and also acknowledge the hard work and dedication of our teaching staff for their on-going support of learning. This is a summary of the three core curriculum areas show the number and percentage of students working below, at our above expected curriculum level at the end of 2024. The number in brackets denotes the number of students in each area.

Reading: Below 13% (29) At 24% (52) Above 63% (135)

Maths: Below 17% (36) At 32% (70) Above 51% (110)

Writing: Below 13% (28) At 50% (108) Above 37% (80)
