




### **Thanks**

### **Curriculum Changes**

As part of the refreshed New Zealand Curriculum,
Mathematics is receiving a renewed focus on building
strong number knowledge and problem-solving skills. This
means students will spend more time exploring
mathematical concepts in depth, making real-world
connections, and developing flexible strategies for working
with numbers. There's also a greater emphasis on
mathematical language and reasoning—helping our learners
explain their thinking clearly and confidently. At our school,
we're embracing these changes with rich, hands-on tasks
and opportunities to explore maths in meaningful ways.
We're excited to see our ākonga (students) growing as
confident and capable mathematicians!

In Term 2 we will be holding a parent/caregiver information session about how we are embracing these changes and what they mean for students and the way we report to parents/caregivers. Here's an example of a rich mathematical task from Maths No Problem which the resource we have elected to use.

#### Explore

Amira, Tama and Ravi collected 234 toys for the school gala.

Tama collected 16 more toys than Amira did.

Ravi collected 3 times as many toys as Tama did. How many toys did each of them collect?
