### From Mrs Campbell

Dear parents/whanau,

We held our first Board Meeting of 2026 last night, where we were pleased to share our 2025 end-of-year achievement data with the Board.

As part of our annual review, we report on the three key curriculum areas and carefully analyse the data to identify our next priorities and areas for continued improvement. This process helps ensure our teaching programmes remain responsive, targeted, and aligned with the learning needs of our ākonga.

The 2025 data is a strong testament to the dedication and professionalism of our staff, who work tirelessly to provide high-quality teaching and learning opportunities across the school. It also highlights the powerful impact of the support from our whānau – particularly the encouragement of reading, home learning, and positive learning habits.

When school and home work together, our students are better able to challenge themselves, explore new learning, and treasure their progress, and this is clearly reflected in our overall achievement.

The number in the bracket denotes the number of students in each percentage.

#### Comparison to National Trends

##### Reading

Nationally, around **65%** of students meet expectations in reading.

**Ramarama School: 74%**

**We outperform the national average by ~9 percentage points.**

##### Writing

Nationally, **only around 60%** meet expectations in writing.

**Ramarama School: 86%**

**This is a major strength – far above average.**

##### Maths

Nationally, **67-70%** meet expectations.

**Ramarama School: 83%**
